



Preparing for the
*Arrangement
Conference*

We understand how hard it can be to find the strength to overcome the loss of someone you love. We hope this will help you be better prepared to discuss important information during your meeting with a funeral director.

Your arrangement conference is a time to discuss options and make important decisions regarding the type of arrangements you will make to honor the wishes of your loved one. It is helpful to come prepared with a general idea what type of services you would like.

Funeral Services

The funeral ceremony is not unlike other ceremonies that distinguish our lives. Today, funeral arrangements are as individual as the persons for whom and by whom they are made. Green Valley Mortuary Chapel features our “Commemoration of a Lifetime” video tribute program to present a lifetime of memories and help families celebrate the joy of a life well lived. Because a funeral service is a special tribute to the life of an individual, we work hard to help you create the perfect memory.

Cremation Services

We offer many cremation options. Some families have ceremonies preceding or following the actual cremation. Prior to the cremation there may be visitation and/or a funeral with the body present. If a ceremony is conducted following cremation, the urn may take a place of prominence. The urn is taken to its final resting place following this ceremony. Just as ceremonies offer value to the living, so does establishing a permanent memorial to serve as a focal point for the remembrance of a loved one.

Cemetery Services

Green Valley and most other cemeteries offer traditional burial plots, personal and community mausoleums. Niches, ground burials, and scattering gardens are available as permanent resting places for cremated remains. "Freedom's Field" is a prominent section of our cemetery dedicated to veterans and features options for traditional and cremated remains disposition.

The funeral director will collect biographical and statistical information to prepare and file legal documents and certificates on your behalf. The following is information you should bring to the arrangement conference:

- Full name, date and place of birth of deceased
- Social security number and level of education
- Type of occupation and years worked
- Address of residence and number of years in county
- Full names and states of birth of parents

Other items to bring to your appointment:

- Clothing and photo of deceased
- Photos (40) and music for "Commemoration of Life" video production
- Method of payment (check, cash, or credit card)
- Military Discharge Papers (DD-214)
